## WINTER BALL PROCEEDS SET RECORD Rotoplast “Fund a Need” Brings in \$93,000

## Fine Master,

**Paul Krsek's** topic was none other than the Winter Ball and he began his time with a statement that "the legacy of Winter Ball will be, NOT about how much money was raised, but how the St Helena Rotary Club has taught the Napa Valley to raise money!! Paul began



his fine master duties calling on **Nick Bermudez** who had been present but had slipped out ... as a result, Nick was charged the full \$80 since his fine amounts were at "\$0.00". Nick, you are done for the year on fines now! **Lydia Wilson, Bob Graham, Steve Carboni** and other Rotarians were quizzed on the year to year Winter Ball revenue increases... The 1st Winter Ball raised \$46,000 and by the 7th Winter Ball we had raised \$100,000. It took 6 years to hit \$200,000 in 2003, \$300,000 in 2004, \$400,000 in 2005, and Winter Ball hit \$500,000+ in 2006 and once again in 2007!

**Program:** **Rob Andrae** raised a glass [since we were all drinking that fabulous '94 Beringer Cabernet] to the success of one more Winter Ball prior to announcing his guest, **Lisa B. Martin, of The Netza Project, The Promise of Education for All, sponsoring education in Zihuatanejo, Mexico.**



Lisa began her presentation with a little history of how she got involved and created a 501 3-C Non Profit Corporation to assist in educating the indigenous children of Mexico. Eight years ago while vacationing in Zihuatanejo, speaking only three words of Spanish herself, Bano, Cerveza and Taxi, she observed small children working o the beach as "Chicaleros", aptly named as they were selling "Chicklets" gum to beach goers.

The children of the indigenous Indian tribes of Mexico speak one of the four indigenous languages. Because they do not speak Spanish and are extremely poor living on \$1 - \$2 per day, they are unfortunately caught in a no win situation involving a public education system which is not free and does not allow anyone to attend that does not speak Spanish... as a result these children are overlooked in terms of obtaining any kind of education. The Netza Project is responsible for building a school house and a library and providing the necessary sup-

plies to educate and teach these children. The children are being taught Spanish so that they can continue their education beyond Zihuatanejo...

Lisa arrived to late to contribute a hand embroidered shawl to the Winter Ball but brought it to the Rotary meeting which was auctioned to the highest bidder, Mark Terrell for \$600. It only takes \$400 per year to educate one of these children!

## BOY SCOUTS TROOP I PRESENTATION

Boy Scout Troop One Scoutmaster Stu Smith treated the club to an annual recap of the year's activities, coupled with a preview of the coming year's events and an award ceremony.

Jimmy Sweeney was named Scout of the Year, and was presented with a \$200 gift certificate. The RLS student earned a 3.86 grade point average and a spot on the honor roll. He is a Carpy Gang player and a member of the wrestling team.

Matt Ebersole came in second and received a \$100 gift certificate. Third place was shared by four scouts – Dillon Rahn (an all-league football player), Craig Ebersole, Chris Collins and Thatcher Green.

Matt Phelps was named Rookie of the Year. Others in attendance at the luncheon were scouts Will Smithers, Chris Mareno and Henry Green. Scout leaders in attendance included Dr. Bob Darter, Chris Phelps, John Dodge, Andrea Green, Sharon Ebersole and Ann Sorensen.

Scoutmaster Smith presented a slide show of the past year's outings, noting that Troop One has been in existence for more than 83 years and currently enrolls 28 scouts.

The highlights included cross-country skiing, snow camp at Silver Lake, Snow Mountain Wilderness, Thunder Mountain, Big Sur Wilderness, Camp Lassen, Las Posadas and wilderness survival. Last July, the troop held a memorial service near Mt. Whitney in honor of Stephen McCullagh and Ryan Collins, killed a year earlier during a hiking trip. During the memorial, scout Carl Ericson was recalling the fateful lightning strike when something strange happened.

"I was sitting right here and ... there are my glasses," an astonished Ericson said, pointing to the spectacles he lost a year earlier.

"We try to give an introduction to all you can do outdoors, from canoeing to hiking, to kayaking, to sailing, to archery and rifle sports," Smith told the Rotarians. "We try to give them a sense of ability to do this, to survive and to rely on themselves."

Every October, the troop sells tri-tip at the Harvest Festival to raise funds for scouting. Every January, the troop raises money by picking up Christmas trees. In February, the group manages an aid station for the Napa Valley Marathon, and in March, they head to Bear Valley at the foot of Mt. St. Helena. Next Easter, the scouts are heading out on an eight-day trip to the Flagstaff area, where 22 members will visit the Navajo cliff dwellers. In April, there's the spring Camporee at Lake Berryessa. This summer, the older scouts will hike 113 miles along the Birch River, north of Fairbanks, which drains into the Yukon. The younger scouts will head out to the Sierras.

### St. Helena Rotary Foundation

Board of Directors Meeting  
February 20, 2007

The meeting was held at the Native Sons Hall and was called to order by President Bill Word at 1:37 PM.

**Board members attending:** Bill Word, Chuck Meibeyer, John Sales, Kathleen Patterson, Jeff Epps, Elaine John, Joice Beatty, Hendrik Smeding, and Mike Thomas.

**Minutes:** The minutes from the board meeting held on January 16, 2007 were approved as submitted.

**Treasurers Report:** Bill Word reviewed the Profit & Loss by Class and the Balance Sheet, both as of February 19, 2007 submitted by David Moreland, who was absent. Bill also presented a summary of the 2006-2007 Grants, which have been approved to date and those being requested.

#### **Old Business:**

1. Winter Ball '07- Chuck Meibeyer presented the Winter Ball 2007 Budget (Tentative) and reported that he had been able to reduce costs by approximately \$20,000. Most of the increased costs over last year were due to additional lighting for the event and printing expense. *The Board approved the budget as submitted.*
2. Rotary International Brochures and printed inserts- Bill Word and John Sales reported that the Club Board had approved a funding of \$1,350 representing one half of the cost to purchase 1,000 Rotary International brochures providing information on the organization at a cost of approximately \$0.50 per brochure and the balance budgeted to produce two inserts which would have information regarding our club and the Winter Ball. The brochures and inserts would be used in attracting new members, potential donors and other purposes as needed. *The Board approved funding \$1,350 to match the contribution by the Club to fund purchase of 1,000 Rotary International brochures and the cost of producing and printing two inserts providing information on the club and the Winter Ball.*

#### **New Business:**

1. The St. Helena Public Schools Foundation request for a \$25,000 donation was discussed with consideration given to the donations our Foundation has made to the Public Schools Foundation in previous years, their need for additional donations, contributions made to schools in the district by our Foundation in the current fiscal year and diminishing support Public Schools Foundation personnel have given in recent years to assisting in preparations for the Winter Ball and attending the event. *The Board approved a donation of \$10,000 to the St. Helena Public School's Foundation to be accompanied by a "soft letter" indicating the lack of flexibility in our budget and contributions already made this year to the schools in the district as well as major contributions to the Boy's and Girls Club and other local causes.*
2. The St. Helena Skatepark, Inc.'s request for a donation of \$31,570 was continued until the Board meeting following the Winter Ball in March.
3. *The Board approved a \$1,000 donation to Hospice of Napa Valley to support Adult Day Services.*
4. *The Board approved a \$1,050 donation to Rotary District*

*5130's Cool Kids Camp to support the attendance by three children.*

5. *The Board approved a contribution of \$1,500 to the St. Helena Community Food Pantry.*

The meeting was adjourned at 2:30 PM with the next meeting scheduled at 11:00 AM, March 20, 2007 at the Native Sons Hall.

**Public Relations Director:** Donn Black

- a. Website. A link to online make-up meetings has been added to the Club's website. Go to the Make Up Clubs link and then link to the on-line make-ups web site.
- b. New Club Brochure. Review of draft brochure and discussion of its proposed uses, including club members, new member prospects, fund-raising, Winter Ball solicitations and general public relations. A reference to senior citizen projects will be added. Motion made, seconded, and unanimously approved to order 1,000 copies of the brochure at a cost not to exceed \$1,650 on condition that the Foundation pay half for 500 brochures to be used for Winter Ball solicitations and promotion. Funds in the Club's budget for International House will be moved to a new account and used to defray the cost

- b. District Speech Contest. - 1 million solar roofs equals 3000 megawatts
- Hoover Dam produces 4 billion megawatts in 1 year
- Cal. Solar Initiative will produce 7 Billion megawatts by year 2017
- What is the PG&E baseline price per kilowatt-hour that you pay? 11 cents
- What is the PG&E baseline price per kilowatt-hour @ the 200% above baseline rate? 22.9 cents
- What is the PG&E baseline price per kilowatt-hour @ the 300% above baseline rate? 32 cents
- Average rate increase per yr. over last 10 yrs. 3% per yr or 30% total
- "Solar comes from the sun," Rex Stults
- State rebate is performance based. \$2.50 rebate per watt produced by your system. 1000 watts = 1 kilowatt
- Fed tax incentive 30% up to \$2000
- Combined rebate (State + Fed) could be up to 50% of installation cost
- \$25k residential system pay off could be 7 to 10 yrs
- Warranty 25yr on collector panels and 10 years on inverter
- Not considered a capital improvement by county. No reassessment of property value

# UPDATE ON THE NEW SKATEBOARD PARK

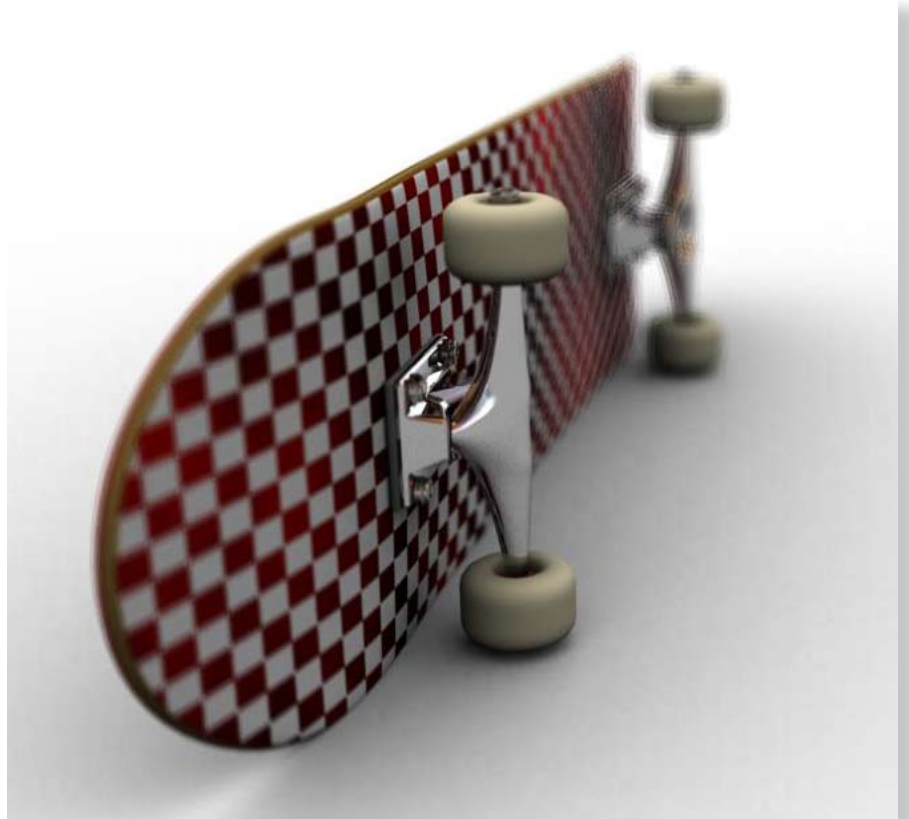


Skaters rule, dude! And Pam Smithers is a local mom dedicated to promoting a safe environment for St. Helena youth to prove it. It all started a year ago when several entities got together to discuss the impact of skaters around town. The police, local business, and high school weren't happy with the current skate park and were open to discussing alternatives. A modern skate park was the answer: In a place that was easier to patrol, off of the high school campus, and away from down town shoppers.

Kids are people too. So why not do some investigation into location, cost, design, community support, and feasibility? A board of directors was assembled along with an advisory committee and an honorary director by the name of Mike Thompson. The advisory committee includes Rob Andreae, Stan Augustine, Del Britton, Sara Cakebread, Kathleen Carrick, Diane Dillon, Bert Johansson, Rudy Papale, Walker Ryan,

Frank Sotille, Frank Toller, Vera Trincherro Torres and others you may know. They have obtained a 501c3 non-profit status and were awarded the sporting designation of P.O. Box 1 in St. Helena. How cool is that? If you're into letting your fingers do the walking for you then punch in [www.StHelenaSkatepark.org](http://www.StHelenaSkatepark.org)

The site is donated by the City (as well as the insurance, fences, bathrooms, an interpretive trail, and some extra sidewalk for access) and is located on Pope St. between the Bridge, Napa River, and the college. A 1-acre parcel will be covered by 1/2 an acre of skate park features such as ramps, bowls, staircases, handrails, slopes, and 1/4 pipes. Construction time 4-6 months. There is a flow to the skate park structures- when the concrete is first poured and after it cures. That's a joke if you're in construction. Forget it. There is another kind of flow when the Napa River overreaches its banks and flows through the skate park, but not to worry, the Canadian design/build firm desired for the undertaking will accommodate this kind of flow. And of course the most important flow of all is that of the \$650,000 Susan B. Tony's necessary to float the project.
